## HARRASSMENT, INTIMIDATION AND BULLYING (HIB)

## **HOW DO I KNOW?**

In order to assess whether an incident should be reported as a case of HIB, *all three of the following criteria must be met:* 

HIB means any gesture, any written, verbal or physical act, or any electronic communication, whether it be a <u>single</u> incident or series of incidents, that:

- 1 is reasonably perceived as being motivated by any actual or perceived characteristic, such as race, color religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, or a mental, physical or sensory disability, or by any other distinguishing characteristic (could be as simple as red hair membership in the band or honor society), AND
- 2 takes place on school property, at any school-sponsored function, or off school grounds, AND
- ${f 3}$  substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school or the rights of other students

## **DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CONFLICT AND HIB**

## <u>Conflict</u> <u>HIB</u>

- \* "Mutually competitive or opposing action or engagement.
- \* Includes disagreements, arguments and fights.
- \* A normal part of growing up and of life.
- HIB is one-sided
- One or more students are victims of one or more person's aggression, as it applies to the HIB definition under the ABR.
  The intent is to physically
- \* The intent is to physically or emotionally hurt someone.
