# OCEAN CITY'S SUPERINTENDENT WINS STATE AWARD

Dr. Kathleen Taylor is the Superintendent of Ocean City School District. She was recently named the Superintendent of the Year in the State of New Jersey. On October 25th, Dr. Taylor was honored by the New Jersey Association of School Administrators. She was awarded by Ocean City Board of Education President Joe Clark and Vice President Jacqueline McAllister. Dr. Taylor will represent New Jersey in the American Association of School Administrators Competition. The winner of this award will be announced in the spring of 2018

With 24 years experience as a school administrator Dr. Taylor came to Ocean City in 2006. She previously served in Sea Isle City and Haverford Township, Pennsylvania. Dr. Taylor has been in the Ocean City School District for 12 years. She started in 2006, which means the kids that were in Kindergarten when she started are now graduating from Ocean City High School this year! Dr. Taylor is a past president of the Cape May County Superintendent's Association. She also currently serves on the Ocean City Education Foundation and the Chamber of Commerce. She was recognized by the New Jersey State Board of Education on December 6th. She was one of two regional superintendents of the year, along with Charles Sampson of the Freehold Regional High School District, that were named at New Jersey School Boards Association Workshop. This took place on October 25th in Atlantic City.

We had the opportunity to interview Dr. Taylor about her award! We asked Dr. Taylor how did she feel when she received the award. Dr. Taylor responded, "I was very happy and excited to receive this award. I am very proud that I am a part of the Ocean City School District. I am also very proud because this award belongs to all of us here in Ocean City." We then asked Dr. Taylor if she was proud of her accomplishment. She said, "I am very proud of this accomplishment. However, what I'm most proud of is our students, teachers, and staff that work together. This is really *our* award because we work together as a school community to make our school district as great as it is." Then, we asked if this was the first time that she received this award and Dr. Taylor explained, "It is the first time I received a state award, but I have been awarded for other



recognitions." Last, we asked Dr. Taylor how hard is it to be a superintendent. Dr. Taylor responded, "It is hard work and it takes a lot of time. However, the rewards are many because I am able to be with the students every single day."

This year a LEGO car racing tournament is happening during our technology class at the Ocean City Primary School. Third graders at the school have been challenged to engineer a LEGO racecar that will race against other cars. Each student works in a team with two other students and had to design a really fast car. First, we came up with ideas and then drew pictures of what we thought the car would look like. Next, we went to the LEGO-Space and built the cars using different colored LEGOs. Once we built them, we tested them on our brand new racing track that our PTA bought for us. Now, we are getting ready to race them in a tournament!

The yellow racing track holds 4 cars at a time and is really long. At the end of the track is a scoreboard that tells you how many seconds it took for the car to get down the track. The cars get put in a lane and Mr. Kohr counts down, 3-2-1, and then flips a button. "Swish!" the cars zoom down the track!

We asked Mr. Kohr why he thought of doing the LEGO racing and he said, "I wanted the third grade students to have an opportunity to learn about engineering. LEGOs are a great way for students to build and then re-build their own designs. But most importantly, what is more fun than LEGOs!?" We asked him where all of the LEGOs came from and he said, "Last year third grade students came up with the idea for the LEGO-space. They wanted a place to build stuff! They ordered the 65,000 LEGOs that are in the room now." Last, we asked him which car was his favorite and he said, "I can't choose just one, I love them all! All of the third grade teams came up with really interesting and unique designs, I was so impressed!"

We asked our friend Josh from Ms. Naplacic's class what he thought about the project, "It is really fun for the third graders because mostly everyone loves LEGOs and we were really pumped up to get into the new LEGO room!" The racing tournament is going to happen in February and March and the winning team gets a prize! We can't wait to see who wins! On your mark, get ready, LEGO RACE!



A green screen looks like a big green sheet and around it are a bunch of weird looking umbrella lights that help with the lighting. So you stand in front of the sheet with a regular video camera, but the green screen makes it look like you're somewhere else other than where you are . It takes the green background and replaces it with a different video. For example, if you wanted to be in a baseball stadium the green screen would make it look like you're in a baseball stadium or on top of Mount Rushmore!

We asked Mr. Kohr how it works and he said, "the video that we capture goes into a video editing program on the computer that can recognize anything that is green and flip it with a different video.
