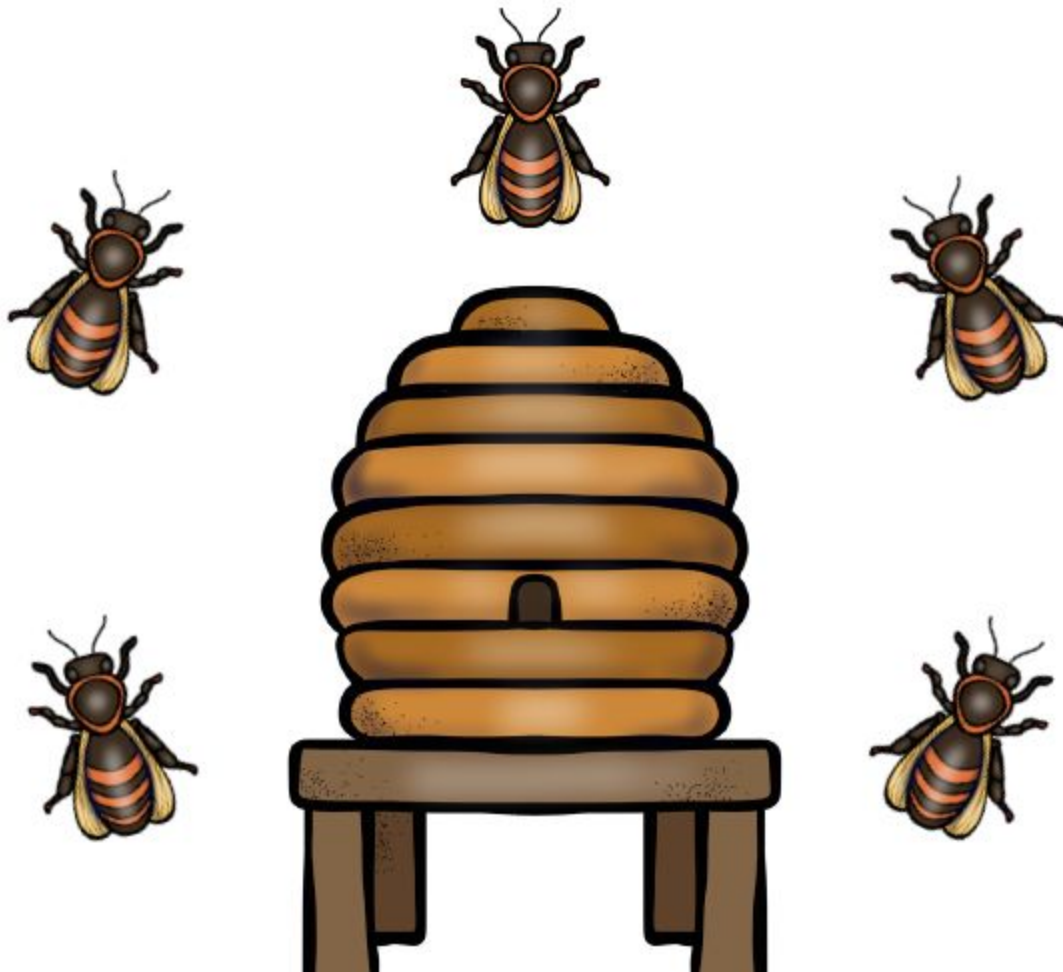
Rain, rain,
