BE IT RESOLVED by the Ocean City Board of Education, that it is necessary to meet in executive session to discuss certain items involving: Matters involving anticipated or pending litigation, including matters of attorney-client privilege, and specifically: Litigation / Potential Litigation; Matters involving personnel issues, including but not limited to, the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and

conditions of employment, evaluation of performance, promotion or discipline of any public officer or employee, and specifically: Staff Issue.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any discussion held by the Board which need not remain confidential will be made public as soon as feasible. The minutes of the executive session will not be disclosed until the need for confidentiality no longer exists.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education will return to open session to conduct business at the conclusion of the executive session.

The meeting adjourned into Executive Session at 8:04 p.m.
